It's no surprise that problem gambling has an effect on personal relationships. It is estimated that for each problem gambler, eight to ten (8-10) people are adversely affected. This includes romantic partners, children, friends, coworkers, and members of the gambler's extended family.

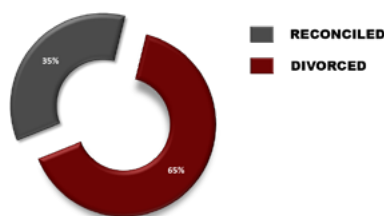
For years we have all heard that finances are the number one cause of divorce. Could you imagine the added stress of your spouse losing hundreds or even thousands of dollars on the unlikely outcome of winning the lottery, a poker game, or

a slot machine jackpot? At the Florida Council on Compulsive Gambling (FCCG), we receive hundreds of calls each year from Floridians seeking support or advice after having recently discovered their significant other has a gambling problem. Unfortunately, statistics show that sixty-five percent (65%) of marriages that consist of a spouse battling a gambling addiction end in divorce.

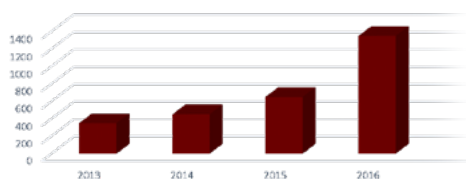
According to data collected from FCCG's 24 hour HelpLine **888-ADMIT-IT** throughout 2016-2017, forty-one percent (41%) of problem gamblers have children under the age of 18 present in their home, creating an increased risk for child abuse and family neglect.
